Central principles in corrections

- Discretionary powers
- Progression towards release
- Emphasis on rehabilitation
- Import of core-services
- One person, one cell
- Principle of normality



Sharp distinction Court - Corrections

<u>Institution</u>	<u>Specific area of expertise</u>	<u>Penal goals</u>
Court	Proportionality	Retribution, Deterrence
Corrections	Recidivism	Rehabilitation, Incapacitation

Examples:

- Pre-sentence reports shall not include suggestions for type of sanction
- Drug court: minimal involvement of court post-sentence
- Rejected pilot proposal for a CJC-approach

	Sanction	Contents
Community sentence	Court	CSN
Drug court	Court	CSN
Release on licence	CSN	CSN
Electronic monitoring	CSN	CSN

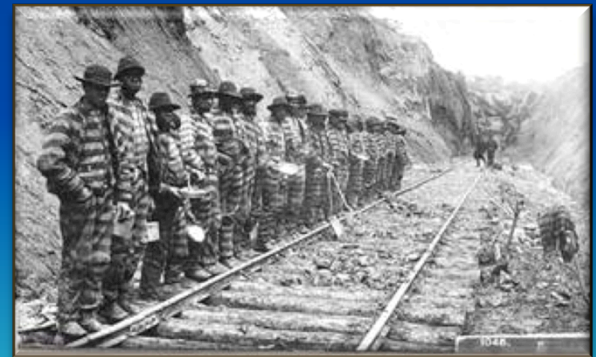
Breach of condition

CSN prosecute!



Legal framework Community Sentence

- Replaces up to 1 year unconditional imprisonment
- 30 – 420 hours
- Completion within a time set by the court
- Probation office does intake and decides on contents
- Must include one-to-one offence-oriented conversations
- No more than 70 % unpaid work
